Awaiting the arrival of Santa Claus, over 400,000 street side spectators and 75 million cable homes will be moving their feet to the melodic carols of marching bands, gazing skyward at the gigantic inflatable helium balloons making their way down State Street, and waving at the talented entertainers in decorative floats dispensing holiday cheer. There is fun to be had by all at the biggest holiday parade in the Midwest!

This year's parade is bigger and better than ever, including appearances by the world-famous Budweiser Clydesdales (also celebrating their 75th anniversary), the Chicago casts of "Jersey Boys" and "Dirty Dancing," the flametwirling Barefoot Hawaiians, current World Wrestling Entertainment™ Superstar CM Punk, and the Red Hats

and Purple Chaps.

Spectators will be wowed with the acrobatics of the Jesse White Tumbling Team, the toe-tapping tunes of the Official McDonald's Thanksgiving Parade Band performed by Proviso East High School, and the rhythmic movements of Renacer Boliviano Folkloric, plus an over-the-top opening performance by the stars of Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey®.

12 sky-scraping giant characters soaring above State Street.
Twenty-five marching bands
from 10 states will also
participate.


Starting as the Christmas
Caravan in the 1930s, the
parade was created to help lift
the spirits of residents
suffering though the Great
Depression. The parade
moved to State Street in 1935,
as economic conditions forced
the floats to be pulled along
with trolley carts. Through the

years, the parade has seen a few changes, but has always remained a staple in Downtown Chicago. McDonald's has participated in the parade for over 20 years and was title sponsor of the parade from 1984-1989 and the past two years.

WGN-TV9 and WGN-DT 9.1 will air the parade live and in high definition from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. CST on Thursday, Nov. 27. WGN America will also broadcast the parade nationally, establishing it as one of only three parades in the country to be covered live, in its entirety, on a national television broadcast.
